

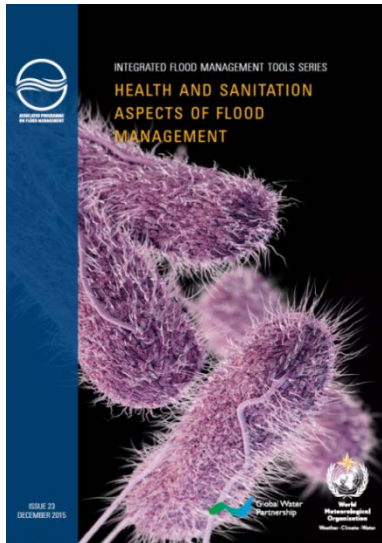

Proposed Outreach Activities

- 🌀 Try to involve the diplomatic environment to advocate for IFM
- 🌀 Geographical distribution: consider having materials/webpages translated in Spanish and French
- 🌀 Consider advertising HelpDesk available facilities in Spanish and French as well
- 🌀 Development of short videos devoted to non-technicians (elevator speeches)
- 🌀 Try to track keywords leading to APFM website
- 🌀 Volunteering SBPs to act as outreach antennas in their region/country
- 🌀 Try to link the Repository of know-how assembled by BoM on Flash Floods to the HelpDesk
- 🌀 SBPs to share relevant information with Outreach Officer regarding ongoing/future activities, particularly when this involves use of APFM materials
- 🌀 Include in the catalogue of services findings from the Tour de Table
- 🌀 UN-HABITAT III – joint session with UNESCO-IHP (APFM to provide materials)



General items

- Zoï to provide text for inclusion in the annual report on training activities in the Dniestr
- Identify target group for trainings based on needs → thematical courses focusing on practical hands-on «how to»
- Coordinate with SBPs providing trainings to avoid repetitions and/or overlapping (see: catalogue of services)

Proposal for MC regarding scenario adoption

Proposal to adopt scenario 4.5 :

- Main target group: local and national stakeholders
- Include E2E FFEW
- Present IFM and IDM as a single “service” to optimize marketing
- Set up milestones every six months to assess advancement
- Revisit the budget allocation to close the 18 months at zero balance
